Pruning location is critical to the tree's growth and wound closure. The first cut should go only about 25 to 30 percent into the branch to prevent the saw from binding. The second cut should result in a clean "fissure break" to the first cut; the third and final cut should be just outside the branch collar, not into it.

In addition to early spring and midsummer, pruning after new growth has hardened is acceptable for pines and spruce trees. Juniperus spp.- junipers and Thuja spp.- arborvitae can be pruned up to mid-August. When a branch is causing safety concerns, you can override the seasonal recommendations for pruning.

Prune a newly planted tree for the first year, unless you are removing dead or broken branches. Prune within 10 feet of a utility conductor – leave it to the pros. Try to tackle a pruning job that requires a chain saw and ladder work – leave it to the pros. Leave branch stubs, or cut off the branch collar (not make a flush cut).

Tree Pruning Dos and Don'ts | Tree Care Tips

The extent of thinning in a year should be in the range of 10-15% of the live crown and should not exceed 25% in any case, especially for mature trees. Don'ts: Clearing too much inner foliage will adversely affect the health of a tree. Vigorous production of watersprouts on interior limbs indicates over-thinning.

DO's and DON'Ts in Pruning - Greening

Flowering TreesIf your purpose for pruning is to enhance flowering: 1. For trees or shrubs that bloom in summer or fall on current year's growth (e.g., crape myrtle), prune in winter. 2. For trees that bloom in spring from buds on one-year-old wood (e.g., dogwood and flowering fruit trees), prune when their flowers fade.
