Unhappiness about this state of affairs led to what might be considered the first plain English law: the Statute of Pleading, enacted in 1362. The law, written in French, recited that French was much unknown in the realm; it therefore required that all pleas be “pleaded, shewed, defended, answered, debated, and judged in the English Tongue.”

The movement to use Plain English in law – rather than Legalese – has been around since the 1950’s when Stuart Chase addressed the issue in The Power of Words (1953). President Nixon created momentum for the Plain English movement in 1972 when he decreed that the Federal Register be written in “layman’s terms.”

Law and requirements. The Plain Writing Act of 2010 was signed on October 13, 2010. The law requires that federal agencies use clear government communication that the public can understand and use. While the Act does not cover regulations, three separate Executive Orders emphasize the need for plain language: E.O. 12866, E.O. 12988, and E.O. 13563.

First law (sometimes called inertia. If a body is at rest it remains at rest or, if it is in motion, it moves with uniform velocity, until it is acted on by a net force.; A uniform velocity means that an object moves at a constant speed without changing direction (i.e. in a straight line).
